   please contact a member of the planning team as well.



# Journey to Brazil with Lower Columbia FFI - April 2024

ing this for the first time. We hope to be able to assign JCs for all 2024 journeys within the next several months.



# FRIENDSHIP FORCE OREGON'S MID-WILLAMETTE VALLEY ZOOM BOARD MEETING - NOV 8, 2023

President Sharon Harr called the Zoom meeting to order at 1:03. Present: Sharon Harr, Dennis Murphy, Chris Duval, Rosie Brabeck, Jim Brabeck, Russ Karow, Kathy Butler.

Russ moved to accept the minutes of the August board meeting as corrected. Also accepted board minutes of Oct. 20 meeting. Chris seconded. Minutes accepted.

Treasurer's report: Dennis had emailed the report to the board on Nov. 7. There were no questions. Dennis pointed out that he distinguished between dues from last year and this year. Suzanne Strite had asked about a tax deduction for her expenses for the ice cream social for the Denver journey. Russ has a form for deductions that he will send Dennis. Dennis will prepare a budget for next year. He said the club is in good financial condition. He has a Quicken backup file for financial records of the club that is stored on the club's archive website.

Journey Coordinator Report: Chris Duval - we need volunteers for the incoming North Carolina journey in late April, 2024. She has emailed everyone in the club asking about this. Dennis asked if we could use the N. Carolina workshop as a training for J.C.s, but Chris said the JC training will be in January. Chris has a form from FFI to fill out about how many people we can host and when (what time of year) we can host. Dennis may be the one to receive forms from FFI.

The Tokyo club is coming to us on May 31. The Charlotte N. Carolina club is coming in late April.

Chris said she will no longer be the Journey Coordinator in 2024, as she has done it for several years.

President's report: Sharon reported on a conversation with Tom Best.

The 2024 World Conference will be Oct. 7-10 in Milwaukee, Wisconsin.

FFI dues will go up from \$25 to \$30 next year.

The question of what to charge people who join in mid-year will be settled by FFI.

There has been some discussion about the word "Force" in our title. Many people don't like it.

The problem of people getting too old to travel is international. Clubs world-wide are dealing with it.

Tom Best encourages themed journeys. This is a topic we could investigate in the coming year. Open World is no longer available for this year.

Our bylaws say officers can only serve 2 year terms. The general feeling is that this is healthy.

Newsletter editor report: Russ needs information for newsletter by around Nov. 25. He has been putting announcements about our activities on the radio. Sharon will explore how to get publicity in the G.T. /D.H.

Nov. 19 general meeting: Sharon will bring pies for refreshments. She will ask Rita about plates and silverware.

We will vote on the slate of officers. Russ will announce the slate and ask for nominations from the floor. New officers will take office in January.

Chris will tell about Ted Powell's invitation to a club-wide dinner at their house on Dec. 8 with a \$20 white elephant. Russ suggested having the white elephant be a used object.

Sharon will ask for a Friendship Shared coordinator for next year.

Dennis suggested having a brief review of the year's activities. Russ offered to do this, including a few slides on the Croatian World Conference.
