# General Meeting - Mar 17, 2 pm - Mennonite Home

Our March 17 general meeting will be held in the multipurpose room of the Mennonite Home. *Please note that this is not the usual location in the Mennonite Village*. The Mennonite Home is the location also known as the "nursing home", and it is located on 53rd between Columbus and Clay Streets in the Mennonite Village. Enter the Mennonite Village at 5353 Columbus St SE, Albany Oregon 97322. Be sure to use the entrance lane, not the exit. Do not enter the Village from either the north or south entrance/54th or 47th Street. Immediately turn left. Looking straight ahead you will see a 3 story building to the right about a 1/2 block away. That is the Mennonite Home. Park near the building and enter the building using the front entrance on 53rd. There is no parking immediately in front of the building. The multipurpose room is on the first floor of the Mennonite Home.

The meeting will begin at 2 pm and will include updates and planning for upcoming journeys (see related articles on North Carolina, Tokyo, Sacramento, and Iowa) as well as a short presentation by Marilyn Peterson on the history of Friendship Force International. FFI was founded on March 1, 1977. Each March 1st since has been celebrated as World Friendship Day. Others who have memorable, short stories about their experiences with FFI, please come prepared to share. Anniversary cake will be provided. Please bring you own beverage. Mennonite Village community members have been invited to this meeting.




tour before but it should be an enjoyable and different way to see the Columbia Gorge.

#### Jan 19 2024 FFOMWV Board Meeting Minutes

President Sharon Harr called the virtual meeting to order at 3:59. Board members present were Dennis Murphy and Mary Ellen Lind, Chris Duval, Marla and Russ Karow, Kathy Butler and Chris Kastella.

Minutes of Nov. 19, 2023 need to be approved. Dennis said that the vote to accept the slate of officers should say the vote was unanimous. With that correction made, Chris Duval moved to accept the minutes, as well as the minutes of the Board meeting on Dec. 13. Russ seconded the motion and minutes were accepted.

**Treasurer's Report**: Dennis reviewed the year end financial report and the 2024 budget with the board. This report had been sent to all board members prior to the meeting. He asked who should be provided the 2023 financial books to be audited. It was recommended that he ask Van Nichols or Eileen Minette to do so. He pointed out that the club provides a supplement of up to \$50 per incoming ambassador to reduce the financial expenses for hosts. He noted that these funds should not be included in the journey budget that is used to decide the incoming ambassador journey cost, but applied afterwards to reduce host costs as is appropriate.

**Friendship Shared** income for several years has been donated to charities voted on by participants. Everyone who joined FFOMWV in 2023 gets a free ticket to a Friendship Shared event. Those who joined in 2022 won't get it unless we vote to do so. Carolyn Powers and Jonathan and Lisa Schachter joined then. Russ moved to include the 2022 members, Chris D. seconded the motion, and it passed.

Journey Updates: Chris D. said the request for destinations in 2025 needs to be sent in soon. She suggested having a general conversation at the Jan. 21 meeting. We could present copies of the form listing clubs and their capacities for hosting and have our members sign up for places they would like to visit. The form could include a space for members to indicate their willingness to lead the exchange. Russ offered to provide copies of the form for the meeting.

Inbounds: The Tokyo Inbound, May 31-June 6, is in progress, but we still don't know how many people will come.

Limberg, Belgium wants to know if we would like to visit them only between May 1 and May 12. Dennis will ask on Sunday. Biarritz, France, would like us to come in the second half of June. They can take 10-12 people.

We are waiting for an inbound from Charlotte, N.C. in late April. No one from our club has agreed to lead this journey.

Dennis asked how many of our members have signed up to be hosts. Marla said six people have said they will host. Chris K. said she can host 2-4 people.

A new date has not been set for a JC training. We are now looking at March. Dennis would like to see us actually plan a journey at this training. Maybe we could get 5 or 6 people together to plan some set programs. Dennis feels it might encourage members to lead inbound journeys if they didn't have to start from scratch with the planning.

Another inbound from Sacramento in October is planned. Arnie Abrams would lead, but wants to have a co-leader.

#### Outbounds:

The Festival at Sea is Aug. 23-Sept. 1.

Outbound to Cedar Rapids and Iowa City from Sept. 30 - Oct. 6. We still need a leader.

North American Conference in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, Oct. 7-10.

**Next general meeting:** Jan. 21 at Pringle Park in Salem. New officers will be installed. Russ offered to do the installation. He also has a 15-minute program ready for the meeting.

**Other business**: We talked about alternating MEGs with general meetings. Consensus was to do that. Marla suggested, though, that we have a Feb. meeting and then another in April.

**More about inbound journeys**: Sharon would like to have more time just to spend with their guests. Dennis suggested making some activities optional.

**Membership**: Dennis said we have 39 members who have renewed so far. Last year we had 58 members. He will call people who have not yet renewed.

Meeting adjourned at 5:33.
