
Thank you to all of you who have helped with the planning for our upcoming inbound visit from Leuven, Belgium.

Planning is continuing for this Journey. The number of ambassadors has dropped to nine at present time. They will all arrive at the Eugene airport on July 31st and the current plan is to do a carpool pick up and to bring them to Avery Park for a potluck welcome that will be open to the entire club. We will try to get a public official who is willing to stop by and say a few words of welcome.

We now currently have sufficient hosts! Thank you to all who have volunteered! There will be one couple, one single man and 6 single women. In this situation, many of us will be hosting just one person. A benefit to this is that we should be more easily able to trade of on the daily activities if we wish.

The coastal trip will begin on Wednesday morning. We will meet in Newport for the Marine Discovery boat ride out into a peaceful Pacific Ocean with hopefully a few whales to be seen. Hotel reservations have been made for that evening. Thursday will hopefully begin with a program at the Hatfield Marine Science Center. The balance of the time on both days will be open for the ambassadors and their hosts to make their own plans.

Friday will begin at Oregon State University at the Horticulture Farm at 9 AM. At 10 AM we will have a presentation on the hazelnut industry followed by a conversation with members of the OSU Organic Growers Club. It is possible that we may have a meal prepared at the Horticulture Farm.

As soon as we have the names a bio information on our ambassadors, we will start the matching process and if you are interested in participating in this, please let us know.

One area still open in the planning is the farewell day. We would like to have a venue where we are in a private setting where we can enjoy conversations and be able to do farewell presentations. We envision it to be a situation where the food is either catered or well-coordinated but not a potluck. If you have ideas or suggestions, your input would be appreciated. We could do an outdoor activity again, but in this case we feel an indoor air conditioned situation would be better.

Finally, we will need help in planning the small group dinners that will take place on either Tuesday or Friday evening.

- sharing some other friendship activity or item that does not allow for longer-term planning



World Migratory Bird Day (WMBD) is an annual awareness-raising campaign highlighting the need for the conservation of migratory birds and their habitats. It has a global outreach and is an effective tool to help raise global awareness of the threats faced by migratory birds, their ecological importance, and the need for international cooperation to con-

serve them. Every year people around the world take action and organize public events such as bird festivals, education programmes, exhibitions and bird-watching excursions to celebrate WMBD. All these activities can also be undertaken at any time on the year because that countries or regions observing the peak of migrations at different times, but the main days for the international celebrations on the second Saturday in May and in October.



FRIENDSHIP FORCE OF OREGON'S MID-WILLAMETTE VALLEY MARCH 8, 2023 ZOOM BOARD MEETING

Present: Sharon Harr – President; Jim and Rosie Brabeck – Co-Vice-Presidents; Dennis Murphy – Treasurer; Chris Kastella – Secretary; Kathy Butler – outgoing Vice President and current Journey Coordinator; Chris Duval – Journey Organizer; Marilyn Peterson – Communications and Member at Large; Mary Ellen Lind – Journey Coordinator; Russ Karow – Newsletter Editor/Archives.

Minutes of February 8th, 2023 Board of Director and February 19th, 2023 General Meeting were emailed and President Sharon asked for approval with one request to remove the exclamation mark in the third paragraph. Russ moved the minutes are approved with the one change and everyone agreed.

JC applications were emailed and Marilyn moved, with Chris Duval seconding, the applications approved as submitted. Unanimous approval. Sacramento – Jim and Rosie Brabeck; Denver – Jim Brabeck and Dennis Murphy

The Treasurer's report was emailed to board members. Dennis noted Pringle Creek declined a donation for use of their building. Marilyn moved that Journey stipend to support hosts be changed from \$35 to \$50 per Ambassador. Motion was seconded by Sharon and after discussion, the motion passed unanimously.

Journey Coordinator Report by Chris Duval

- Belgium, May 18th through the 24th (7 nights) JC's Marilyn Peterson and Kathy Butler 14 Ambassadors signed up. Additional dinner hosts and day hosts are needed. Activities are being nailed down and the workshop will be during the April meeting. It was noted the Chintimini Wildlife Center and OSU Wave Research Center each have a limit of 25 participants.
- Canada, June 17th through the 29th (12 nights) JC's Chris Duval and Mary Ellen Lind 9 applications have been accepted. We are hoping for 10 or 12 Ambassadors to participate.
- Denver, end of July 31st to Aug 5th or 6th JC's Dennis Murphy and Jim Brabeck. 16 ambassadors may come (it is reported that they are very active hike, bike, kayak with some interest in wine, unsure if want to go to coast). 9 of the prospective Ambassadors are single women. If possible, more hosts are needed, and more information will follow.
- Sacramento, Oct 24th through 27th JC's Rosie and Jim Brabeck with assistance from Chris Duval Train reservations will be made as applications received.
- World Conference Oct 2nd to 5th or 6th. Eleven Club Ambassadors will be attending. Early bird registration ends March 10th. Accommodations are filling up fast per Tom Best.
- World Beat Salem June 24th & June 25th this venue in Salem advertises Friendship Force in a multi culture two-day event. After much discussion, the consensus was to not participate this year.

Newsletter - Content due to Russ by March 20th. Send information directly to Russ.

Club Archiving - Russ and Dennis are digitizing old newsletter and journey programs.

- Is it ok for tossing the hard copy paper? Dennis recommends they be offered to the membership, then destroyed if no one wants them.
- Digitized file is kept on the Non-Profit Google Shared Drive which allows 4 signers to access.
- 8 scrapbooks (1997 to 2007) could be put into PowerPoint presentations which shows a bit of history and culture of our club. An OSU
 student intern may be able to be used. Discussion followed. Dennis will look through first to enable better direction should an OSU student intern be used.
- Signup sheet for hostess committee was shared partially at the General Meeting. As a club, we need to make sure the signup sheets clearly list what the signup sheet is for plus ensure each member hands the clip board to a live person vs just sitting it down on a seat where it is not fully shared.
- Russ noted KLCC can run public service announcements for non-profits who hold events. Russ offered to handle these alerts to the general public.
- Tom Best has recommended all clubs review their by-laws plus policies and procedures. Dennis reported the BOD did an informal review of the by-laws during Covid however his recommended the Club focus on the policies and procedures as they seem to be a bit stale. This topic will be taken up later this year.
- Russ reviewed a possible opt-in Friendship Force email list creation to be used for Intl Center, sharing of opportunities of tickets, high end lectures (happiness, AI in marine science), small get togethers, etc. Discussion followed with Russ taking the lead on this project.
- Sharon brought up the organization of Power of \$100 in Corvallis As a non-profit, FFI could receive some exposure through this organization. Marilyn reviewed how a "Travelship" as listed in the bylaws works. Marilyn suggested the Club could use funds as some "Travelships" plus paid for advertising to re-boot our memberships such as what Sacramento did. Marilyn will research the Intl FFI grants (how much, what used for, etc.) and further discussion will follow.

The March MEG will be held on March 13th at Delicias Valley Café in Corvallis.

April General Meeting will be a presentation and orientation on the Belgium Journey – April 23rd at 2:00 at Consumer Power Inc, Philomath. A May MEG will be held with location TBD.

The next General Meeting will be July 16th with a presentation and orientation on the Denver Journey – location TBD.
