The first official date was 3 October 2015, as agreed by then International Coffee Organization and was launched in Milan. This day is also used to promote fair trade coffee and to raise awareness for the plight of the coffee growers. On this day,

many businesses offer free or discounted cups of coffee. Many countries around the world celebrate their own national coffee days at various dates throughout the year. In March 2014, the Member States of the ICO (International Coffee Organization) agreed to organize International Coffee Day on 1 October to create a single day of celebration for coffee lovers around the world.

Friendship Force of Nagasaki to host Albany Peace Seeker delegates

John and Kathy Griffiths developed a strong relationship with their FF guests when the Nagasaki FF Club visited us in May 2000. So strong, that Kathy, who chairs the peace delegation to Nagasaki, was able to obtain an invitation from the Nagasaki FF Club to host the delegates.

The purpose of the Peace Seeker delegation is to be in solidarity with the citizens of Nagasaki as they remember and observe the dropping of the atomic bomb on their city 60 years ago on August 9. Ridding the world of the possibility of another nuclear attack and the proliferation of nuclear weapons is the theme of an essay contest, sponsored by the planners in the Albany high schools.

Two high school students, a teacher and a trip leader (Matt Friesen) will be provided transportation to Nagasaki by Albany donors. It is also possible for others to be a part of the delegation and to contribute by contacting Kathy Griffiths, 541-967-1941 or Don and Betty Rea 541-928-2648.

At its December meeting our FF board approved a motion to support the Peace Seekers, and has appointed Kathy Butler to be on the Nagasaki Delegation Steering Committee as a liaison. Gloria Olson, Barb Callner and others have come forward to help. As Gloria says, "I believe this project is a very important and practical way we demonstrate our FF mission, 'peace through friendship.' as we join with our Nagasaki friends in an effort that is of vital importance to them."
