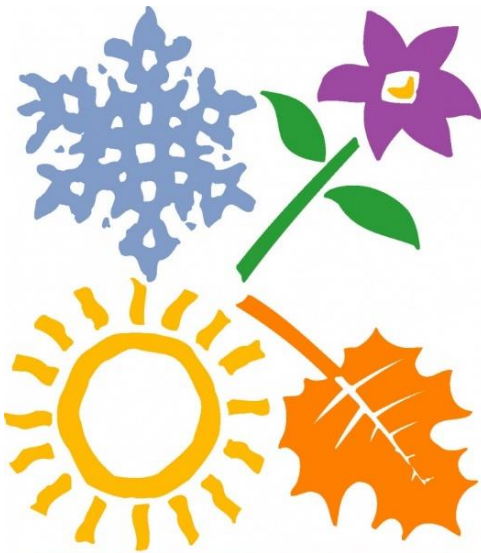


AUGUST ANNUAL MEETING BY CHRIS DUVAL

By happy circumstance, this coincided with the building of Marlene and Michael Cox's beautiful Victorian style home in the country. A small theater was built onto the house! Since then, various local groups have enjoyed a drive down the country lane for an evening of good food, good friends and great entertainment in the intimate setting of a private home. POLICY REMINDERS *BY CHRIS DUVAL*

Following the recent Central North Carolina Journey, feedback indicated that we need a reminder about a couple of important FFI/FFOMWV policies. According to the FFI website:

“FFI has a 40-year history of bringing people together in friendship across the barriers that separate people. We think of ourselves as "citizen ambassadors," each of us having the power to promote good relations at a personal level. A Friendship Force Journey offers an opportunity for people from different parts of the world to share their lives with each other in the spirit of friendship.”

In light of FFI's mission, we all must make efforts to avoid potentially divisive discussions of partisan politics, religion, or other topics that may separate us.

Additionally, FFOMWV has a policy that reads as follows: “Sale of items not benefitting the Friendship Force and its activities is not allowed.”

Thanks for working side by side to further the FFI mission.

NEW JOURNEY POLICY *By Chris Duval*

Residual Funds in Journey Accounts: If there is a residual amount of funds remaining after all expenses of an inbound or outbound Journey have been paid, the overage will be resolved as follows:

- a) If the overage amounts to \$10 or more per ambassador, the funds will be divided among the number of ambassadors and refunded to them.
- b) If the overage amounts to less than \$10 per ambassador, the funds will remain in the Journey treasury to be used in furtherance of future Journeys.

POLICY REVISION *BY CHRIS DUVAL*

At the June board meeting, the board voted to increase the amount of donation made on behalf of visiting and visited clubs, from \$50 to \$150. This money comes from our club funds, not the journey funds. It is given to FFI, either to the annual fund, or the 40th Anniversary fund, to honor our fellow club. The original amount of \$50 has been a policy since 2015 and the board deemed it time to increase the donation amount. Other club's donations to honor our club, have been similarly increased.

The old and new wording of the policy is as follows:

Club to Club Journey Gifts: (06/13/18)

A ~~(\$50)~~ **\$150** donation to the appropriate FFI ~~(Annual)~~ fund, paid from the club treasury, will be made in honor of each hosting or visiting club. However, if the hosting club wishes to support a local cause, the ~~(\$50)~~ **\$150** gift can go to this cause rather than to the FFI ~~(Annual)~~ fund.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

At our August Annual Meeting we will be voting for the slate of 2019 club officers. Our present slate of officers have agreed to continue another one year term. Nominations from the floor will also be taken at the meeting prior to voting. Members may nominate themselves. Please get permission before nominating others.

June 13, 2018

President Chris Duval called the meeting to order at 1:05 p.m.

Minutes of the March Board meeting were reviewed and approved as corrected. MSP (Rita, Eileen)

Treasurer's Report: Checking Account

Journey Coordinator Reports:

Peru/Chili Outbound Int'l: Dennis has a book to mail to Santiago J.C.; he will complete the Journey report; travel insurance claim underway.

North Carolina/Inbound Domestic: Marilyn & Kathy: report to be submitted; host coordinator's final report to be filed with Journey Organizer. Marilyn will evaluate keeping existing walking microphone vs purchase of new walking microphone.

Moscow/Inbound Int'l: September Journey decision pending. Ted & Van working with Ketchikan; no update yet from Moscow.

Oklahoma/Outbound Domestic: Last week in September, 2018. Rita Powell's J.C. application submitted and accepted. MSP (Marilyn, Kathy)

Committee Chairperson Reports:

Marilyn submitted a journey report for the Central North Carolina journey. It will be maintained with journey records by Rita.

Journey Organizer: Rita sent e-mail with summary of Journeys.

- 2019 Inbound Int'l, Indonesia, has cancelled; Edmonton, Alberta, Canada, may be interested reciprocally.
- 2020 Reciprocal/Denver, CO, Spring/Fall; Pike's Peak, CO may join Journey.
- Central North Carolina wants us to come; Florida Suncoast is interested in us visiting them; nothing formal received.
- 2019 Regional Meeting, April 2019, Olympia, Washington.
- 2019 International Conference, July 23-27: Boulder, CO.

Journey Treasurer: Van submitted report via e-mail. Chris to ask Van to produce a report.

Membership: Eileen proposed FFOMWV business cards be developed to offer others' expressing interest to learn more about our club. Picnic at Champoeg Park: members welcomed to bring friends; Eileen to prepare map and directions for newsletter.

Internet Communication: Marilyn said that the website will be on-line within next month. Marilyn wants to be sure that security can be assured. She requested \$72 from club to pay for extension of hosting service. MSP (Eileen, Mary Ellen)

Newsletter: Mary Ellen requested an article on hospital art (from Sharon Harr) and photos and articles from North Carolina Journey. Russ is exploring a location to store archives.

By-laws and Policy Updates: Review of Minutes to follow Archivist & Historian meeting.

Associate Membership Category: New Policy only applies to a few members who are members in more than one FFI club: A FFOMWV member shall be classified as an "Associate Member" if they have a primary membership with another FF club and pay their FFI dues through their primary FF club. Associate Member dues shall equal FFOMWV dues minus FFI charter renewal individual fees. Associate Members shall retain the same membership privileges as full FFOMWV members. MSP (Kathy, Marilyn). Chris to prepare related article for newspaper.

June Board Minutes, continued

Journey Overage Funds New Policy: Chris to work on language to differentiate between Inbound and Outbound Journeys.

Journey Accounting Record Keeping New Policy: Chris reviewed new policy consistent with FFI Journey Guidelines: At the conclusion of every Journey, the Journey Coordinator will provide the board with a financial accounting of the Journey, accounting for all funds, consistent with the FFI Journey guidelines and the records of the Journey Treasurer. MSP (Kathy, Peter)

Journey Guidelines: At the conclusion of every Journey, the Journey Coordinator will provide the board with a brief written report, detailing:

- Journey Number and Name
- Pertinent Journey issues and resolutions
- Copy of booklet or program, if available
- Copies of incident reports, if any.

MSP (Eileen, Kathy) Chris to write article for newsletter.

Hospital Art Update: Sharon to prepare an article for July newsletter; schedule date for members to see installed art at Grace Center, Corvallis; look into possibility of community newspaper coverage.

New Business:

Business Cards: Chris presented a design for new business cards. Board approved purchasing the new cards for distribution to members.

Retractable Sign: Chris presented a design for a new retractable sign and approved purchase of the sign.

Increase in Donation Amounts Revised Policy: Marilyn proposed an increase to \$150 as Club to Club Journey gift from club treasury. Club to Club Journey Gifts: A \$150 donation to the appropriate FFI fund, paid from the club treasury will be made in honor of each hosting or visiting club. However, if the hosting club wishes to support a local cause, the \$150 gift can go to this cause rather than to the FFI fund. MSP (Marilyn, Rita) Chris to write article for newsletter.

Policy on Sales of items not benefitting FFOMWV: Chris to draft a newsletter article reminding members about this policy, as well as advising members to be cautious about discussions of religious or political issues.
