Poker Party! *By Van Nichols*

Russ and Marla Karow opened their door and invited in a group of novice poker players on April 26. We were treated to a table full of delicious “appetizers” including asparagus wrapped in pastry, small beef and smoked turkey sandwiches, vegetable and fruit platter along with cheese and crackers. It is a good thing that I didn’t eat dinner before coming to the party. Instead of flowers, poker chips and cards were the center piece of the table.



We ate our fill then Russ divided up the poker chips and handed out slips of paper indicating the rank of poker hands from high card to royal flush. Each player received three stacks of chips (at no cost). The chips indicated values of \$5, \$10 and \$25. However, they were reduced to 5, 10 and 25 cents to be less intimidating for us novice players. Five card draw was the game of choice.

The dealer put a 5-cent chip in the pot for each of the seven players before dealing out 5 cards to each of us. Bets were placed based on the quality of cards in one’s hand. We were a conservative bunch and a 5-cent chip was the normal bet. Even this small investment led 2 or 3 players to fold right away. Sometimes a brave person would raise the bid by 5 or 10 cents. The 25-cent chip never made it into the pot. Each player can turn in up to 3 cards and receive new cards to try and improve their hand once the bets have been placed. One more round of betting then cards are shown and the person with the high hand takes the pot (most frequently Russ). Free poker chips and low bets led to fun low stress poker playing.

Time flew by and Russ’ chip pile steadily grew until Marla called for a break. Marla served up brownies topped with ice cream. The other important item along with dessert involved selecting the charity to receive the proceeds from the event. Community Outreach in Corvallis received the most votes. The first Friendship Shared of the year ended with acclamations of gratitude from invited guests.

LATIN AMERICAN RELIEF FUND *BY RITA POWELL AND CHRIS DUVAL*



At our monthly gathering on May 19, guest speakers were Sher and Gary Davidson, founders of the Latin American Relief Fund (LARF). LARF is a non-profit, 501(c)(3) organization registered in Portland Oregon, working to support the human rights and dignity of migrants and refugees fleeing violence and poverty in Central America (El Salvador, Guatemala, and Honduras), by assisting *Albergue* ABBA, a migrant shelter in Celaya, Guanajuato, Mexico. LARF provides the monthly rent, utilities and some funds for day-to-day operations to respond to emergency situations caused by variations in migrant flow, including large caravans.

The Albergue ABBA shelter offers to all migrants 3 days and nights' stay with meals in a safe environment, free calls home to their families, medical and psychological assistance, and information on applying for asylum when qualified. Most of the migrants have nothing but the clothes on their backs. Many of them have been robbed, beaten, or raped. They are fleeing the corruption, poverty, and rampant gang and cartel warfare in their own countries.

HOMESTAY AUCTION FUND RAISER

Experience different views.
Discover common ground.

For 2019, the Board has identified the translation of our website into six additional languages as one of our top priorities, making it easier for our current and potential members around the world to learn what we are about and participate in our mission.

Instead of simply identifying this as a fundraising priority, we wanted to find a fun way to bring in donations to fund these translations while also encouraging new friendships – an international homestay auction!

We are challenging each of our clubs to find at least one volunteer member to host a new friend for up to one week. The host commitment is to provide a bed and breakfast for up to one week with no obligation to provide additional meals, tours, or entertainment unless the host wants to provide these to their guests. **We need volunteers to fill out an on-line form by June 1, or as soon thereafter as possible.**

The host's information will be available on the online auction site: www.myminiauction.com/friendshipforce/ - but no names or contact information will be listed, only information about the home and homestay available.

Each homestay will begin with a minimum bid of \$100.00 USD, payable to FFI. Bidding will be open to all FFI members, and each bidder will be notified via email of their bid or if they are outbid. The host's name and contact information will only be shared with the winning bidder when the money for the homestay has been received by Friendship Force International. Winning bidders should be prepared to provide references and answer basic questions for the host as any member would if participating in a regular Friendship Force Journey.

Bidding will be open for approximately six weeks, beginning in the middle of June and closing at the end of July. After the auction, the host and winning bidder will be able to communicate about the logistics of the homestay, set to occur between August 15, 2019 and December 31, 2020. There will be no refund if the homestay is not used.

These homestay weeks made available through the auction could be used to: have a stopover on your way between two locations; extend a Friendship Force Journey for an additional week in a nearby location; enjoy and explore a new destination; visit a friend you have not seen for a while, or make a new friend!

2020 FEE INCREASES *BY CHRIS DUVAL*

We have been notified by FFI that the member affiliation fee will increase to \$20 per individual as set by the Board of Directors. This is an increase of \$5 per member from what we have been most recently paying. The FFOMWV board of directors has discussed this increase and determined that in order to stay solvent, we need to pass this fee increase along to our members. Our current annual fees per person are \$30. **Effective with 2020 membership renewals, our annual fees will be \$35 per person, per year.**

In other fee news, **FFI has adjusted journey fees** as well. The chart below shows the current 2019 fees in the middle column, and in the right column, the 2020 fees that will be put into practice.
